Intervention Technician Report – by Julie Peery

- 1- Hire 6 intervention technicians – work 4 hours per day
- 2- Responsibilities:
 - Math/Science reteach enrichment activities
 - Work with individual students in hallways on literacy and math facts
 - Teach an additional guided reading session to at risk students
 - STEM teaching
 - Run the math lab during lunchtime
- 3- Changes this year – grade levels were given hour chunks of time to make it more beneficial
- 4- Less than 5% of the time are the technicians used to prepare materials for teachers

Technology Report usage – by Kelsey Foster

- 1- Newsela – news articles and non-fiction reading that is available to assign to students on different Lexile levels. Each article contains comprehension questions for students to answer as well as a writing assignment that the teacher may choose to use
- 2- Google Classroom – All writing in 6th grade is completed on a Chromebook. Teachers can make the assignments, attach the instructions and even media. Students will submit their work online where the teacher will grade and give feedback all done online
- 3- Science – new core for 6th grade this year – investigation based – allows students to gather and reason through information
- 4- Interactive web quests
- 5- Coding

Digital Citizenship training

- 1- Encompasses literacy, ethics, etiquette and security of computer use in the schools
- 2- Internet safety is taught to all students in their computer planning time class as well as whole school through the NETSMARTZ assembly in January during White Ribbon Week.
