School math facts program discussion

1. An email was sent to all parents about Imagine Learning Math Facts by Julie including individual log in information for their students.
2. Imagine math purpose: comprehensive math program; used by all 4th grade students for homework and selected 3rd grade students as a math intervention support system
Imagine math facts purpose: Available to all students. It is an optional home use program however is encouraged for those students struggling on their math facts.
3. PTA volunteer program: Parent volunteers and school technicians are working weekly with students to help them become more fluent in their facts.
4. Suggestion made by Whitney Anderson: to produce a survey for parents to complete to see how many students are using the following programs at home: Imagine Learning, Imagine Math, Imagine Math Facts, MyON

Review of Current (2018-2019) School Improvement Plan & Data

1. Data concludes that both academic goals for reading and math were exceeded last year (the goal was to go from 90% to 91% in grades 1-3 DIBELS proficiency or yearly progress. Last year we ended with 93%. In math, the goal for grades 4-6 was to achieve proficiency or make yearly progress on the SAGE assessment and move from 70%-72%. We ended the year on 75%. We will plan to maintain those scores this year.
2. Layne West requested we look at the grade level results individually instead of as a whole. This will be provided at our next SCC meeting in January.
